Pioneer farm village developer welcomes Gauteng stance

DR CHRIS MULDER, one of the pioneers of the farm village concept, which combines residential development with agricultural activity, has welcomed the stance of the Gauteng government on such developments at the expense of goff estates.

"That the concept of productive farm villages, also called agri-estates, is now receiving support from the Gauteng government is an important step forward in preserving the country's diminshing agricultural land and creating work in impoverished rural areas." Mulder said.

"The R3.4 billion development will consist of 780 residential units suited to the needs of a large cross-section of the country's population, and will create an important development node in this area. "It will be the first farm vil-

"It will be the first farm village of this size to be established in South Africa and will also incorporate a light industrial, commercial and retail component along the N2.

"Run by its future home owners' association, Crossways Farm Village will have its own mini-municipality that will provide essential services, from electricity and water to
